An Unexpected Win

[An interview with Celine Lityo, SUSS ISUC 2019 Team Leader of the Champion Team by Ms. Emelly]

Being a new student, Celine was simply curious to know the different programs that JC students like her can join. One of the reasons her parents brought her to NHJS is precisely because the school has a reputation for providing varied learning experiences for their students. The day that Mr. Edward and Ms. Emelly presented the SUSS ISUC 2019 program to the Y11 students, her curiosity turned into genuine interest. She signed up with very little idea what will be in store. She simply wanted to find out what she can get out of this opportunity to learn outside of the classroom.

She has always been a science student, but she cannot deny she finds business activities interesting. She has joined other business competitions in her former school and she has even won some. It could not be all that different, right?

She did not expect to learn a lot... She learned that business ideas may not be as easy to transform into products that will sell. She learned the importance of market research — from designing survey forms, identifying your target segment to the actual conduct of survey. They had to go out and talk to potential customers. They had no idea making strangers stop to listen is going to be so challenging.

She and her team got their taste of failure. The first idea they came up with was rejected by the market they were aiming for. They had no choice but to go back to square one. They went back to the “drawing boards” and had to come up with another idea. This time, it was the RIGHT ONE. Simple yet effective.

Celine still could not believe that her team won the competition. She found the other projects equally good, definitely more interesting than theirs. BUT, one thing she also learned is that one needs to be passionate in order to successfully pitch any idea. She believed (still does) in her product and she simply shared that belief with as much conviction as she could muster. The judges and the audience bought it. She couldn't be any happier.

Her last word? “One cannot learn Business entirely from the books.” Well said, indeed. One needs to be observant and constantly on the lookout for ideas on how to do things better, how to make products more responsive to what customers want.
