SUSS - PIAGET IMPACT STARTUP CHALLENGE

PIAGET Academy under the leadership of the Chairman of the Board of Governors, Mr. William Yiu, entered into a strategic partnership with Singapore's latest public university, Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS) to create learning opportunities for the students from both parties.

An inaugural six-day SUSS-PIAGET Impact Startup Challenge marks the first partnership project between the two institutions and this involves students from Singapore and Indonesia working in teams to pitch their business ideas. A unique feature of the camps is a strong focus on social business proposals and investors are at hand to plough funds into their pet projects.

The best team will win a three-month incubation residency and mentoring programme from Wonderlabs to continue developing their business proposals. The incubation at Wonderlabs' Armstrong Campus in Jogiakarta, includes full access to their dedicated work desk, high speed internet and office facilities. Keith Tan, CEO of Wonderlabs, will personally conduct bi-weekly mentorship sessions to checkpoint the startup's growth and planning. Lastly, the team will also be able to consult Wonderlabs engineers and Wonderlabs CTO Hanif Ali for technical Consultations.
