WSC is an annual international academic tournament which spans four events namely: writing, challenge, bowl and debate. The participants prepared by studying a syllabus of six subjects which cover: Science, History, Social Studies, Literature, Music and Arts, and Special Area. Every year, a new syllabus is released in December.

The NHJS debate club is co-coached by English teachers Mr. Dennis Estavillo and Ms. Archielen Labalan who also adjudicated in the regional round.

The awarding ceremony was held on Tuesday, 23 February 2016 at Sheraton Jakarta Gandaria City Hotel, Jakarta. It was participated by prominent officers of the Cambridge International Examinations as well as different leaders, awardees and parents from different schools.

Anticipating rainfall, the main venue shifted from NH Stadium to NH Multi-Purpose Hall. But despite the change, Ultimate Frisbee and some of the Mini Soccer matches were played in the main soccer field. The other venues were the school pool for Swimming and the Amphitheater for Tug-of-War. The Multi-Purpose Hall became the center of excitement from beginning to end. ## Harvard Model Congress Asia (Seoul Korea)

In early January 2016, 17 members of the NHJS Senior Debate Club participated in the Harvard Model Congress Asia (HMCA). The conference was held in Seoul, South Korea, and was hosted by Seoul National University (SNU).

HMCA is a global conference where international high school students learn and experience government while playing the roles of officials in the United States government and several international political bodies. Students from twenty countries come together and discuss challenges faced by governments worldwide. This conference features one-on-one communication with Harvard students, and debates on global issues and cross-cultural connections among delegates from throughout Asia and around the world.

We started training as early as October. Once it was announced which committee we were in, we had to study our two briefs extensively and prepare our research. We spent time both after school and during the holidays training, working tirelessly to improve our own understanding of the briefs as well as each other's stances as a country or government representative.

I was part of the G20 committee, representing the country of Australia. During the conference, our group was tasked to solve the international water shortage crisis and come up with ways to revive the Middle Eastern economy, while simulating our respective countries as closely as we could. We debated each topic for an entire day and came up with resolutions to the problems. Initially, it all seemed very complicated, as it was my first conference. But as time passed, I began to understand and participate in the discussions. In the end, there was a lot to take from the three-day conference.



Overall, HMCA was a very memorable experience. Not only did I make so many new friends, I had the chance to understand how international organisations work and what kind of problems the world is facing. This was truly an eye-opening experience for me and all of us in the Debate Club.

## Spaghetti Machine Contest

For the first time in NationalHigh Jakarta School, students from Secondary 3 and Junior College 1 joined the Amazing Spaghetti Machine Contest. The Amazing Spaghetti Machine Contest is an international machine-building competition sponsored by the University of Melbourne, School of Engineering in Victoria, Australia. Aside from Indonesia, contestants from India, Malaysia, Singapore, Philippines and Pakistan also joined this contest. It was an exciting and amazing experience for the first-timers. But what exactly is an Amazing Spaghetti Machine?

A spaghetti machine is another name for a Rube Goldberg Machine, which is an outlandish contraption that works in a step-by-step manner and was designed to perform one very simple task. It was inspired by the cartoons drawn by cartoonist/engineer Rube Goldberg (1883 - 1970). The task for the contestants is to build a spaghetti machine that would perform the task that the organisers will identify. It may range from turning a page of a book to turning on a light switch or dropping a coin into a coin bank. This year's contest task is to squeeze out toothpaste from its tube. So why build an overly complex machine to do a simple task? The aim of the contest is for the groups to exercise teamwork and creativity in designing and building such machines. They were also encouraged to apply concepts learned from their Science classes, make use of recycled materials and implement unique ways to do each step in their machines.

Our representatives from Secondary 3 were Geoffrey Budiman, Dave Tirtariyadi, John Muntu and Aaron Johannes, who called themselves as Team Ravioli. The Junior College 1 representatives were Elaine Indra, Rachel Soh, Steven Mahasin and Adnan Sardjito, who named their team as Team Toothpasta. The contest proper started in October 2015 to give the teams enough time to plan and build their respective machines. The final judging of the teams' works was done last November 23, 2015.



The teams had to submit a video of their machine in operation, which was uploaded to [www.youtube.com](http://www.youtube.com) for the judges to view and assess. Although none of the teams won first place, they were happy to know that the top prize winners were from Indonesia, beating Pakistan and Singapore and teams from other countries who joined the contest. Each team received certificates of participation and were recognised by the Principal, Mr. Ang, and the whole student body in one of the morning assemblies.

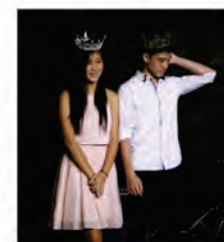
And of course, the famous photo booth, with the glamorous garden background, was also provided for students to capture some memories in this wondrous event.

This event aims to provide a platform for students to develop their aptitude and potential in the biomedical disciplines through critical thinking and problem-solving. It drew participation from Junior Colleges in Singapore, as well as international teams from countries such as China, Indonesia and Malaysia.

Participants were judged based on a university-level of understanding of selected topics in the Musculoskeletal System with an emphasis on the gross anatomy and physiology of muscles, bones and joints, the pathologic states that can afflict the musculoskeletal system, and the common diagnostic imaging and modalities used in the investigation and treatment of conditions in musculoskeletal system.

The IBQ committee, based on the Preliminary-Written Round, awards Gold Medal to individuals, who fall within the top 10% of the participants; the Silver Medal to the subsequent 10%; and, the Bronze Medal to the subsequent 10%.
