Y5 Fieldtrip to Palyja

On the 5th of April 2018, I went to Palyja (PAM Lyonnaise Jaya), a water treatment plant company, along with my fellow Year 5 classmates.

"What is a water treatment plant company?" you ask. To answer that question, it is a water plant company that cleans and filters dirty water for you to be able to shower, wash the dishes, brush your teeth, and so on.

We left school at 7.30 a.m. for Palyja in two buses, with two classes in each bus. It took us around 40 minutes to get there, but it did feel a little longer than that. After what felt like an eternity, we finally reached our destination: Palyja!

Firstly, we entered the building and greeted the Palyja staff. They greeted us in a very warm and lively manner, making us feel welcomed. A woman, who introduced herself as the Manager of the Water Quality Department, briefed us on the safety measures that must be taken in the event of an emergency.

Secondly, the staff led us into a room that looked like it was used for conferences. There, they explained the processes the water we use goes through, from Pre-Sedimentation to Post-Chlorination.

Next, we were divided into two groups, according to our bus groupings. My group was led into the Distribution Monitoring Control Center (DMCC) first. The DMCC was a circular room with four large computer monitors, where you could monitor the happenings in the water tanks, such as the pH level, or the chlorine level in the water. Our guide told us that there would always be someone to monitor the happenings in the water tanks 24/7, with three shifts each day.

Then, a woman led us to a hallway with large windows where we could see what the water tanks and filtration tanks looked like. She also showed us a mini model of Palyja and told us where each of the processes happened, as if the model was a map.

After that, we were led back into the conference room and they showed us a detailed video of what each process looked like. After watching the video, they handed out notebooks and pens to each student as a souvenir of our visit. Lastly, we met up with the other group. Finally, it was time to say goodbye. Our English teacher expressed her appreciation to the staff of Palyja, and we thanked them for having us there. We then boarded our respective buses and headed back to school.

Now, I understand how important water is in our lives. Everyday water plant companies, such as Palyja, work hard to provide citizens like us with water for our daily needs. If we throw trash in the water, we make it harder for them to clean the water, causing the price of water to go higher. We must save water, not letting it go to waste!
