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Over 220,000 Cambridge AS and A level students and a quarter of a million IGCSE students worldwide received their June 2022 results.

In countries and regions of countries where exams could not take place, schools like NHJS submitted a portfolio of three substantial pieces of evidence for each student. Cambridge International examiners have marked this. While some students and schools celebrated the results, it was a big disappointment for those who chose to do the POE route.

Some are relieved that the results are out and that they can finally press forward as planned. At the same time, some are ready to reassess their options as the examinations are underway for those who are considering appealing and resitting in November. The future may seem dismal for some of us because of the results but let this not be a setback. It's perfectly ok to be disheartened if you didn't get the results you wanted because taking the Cambridge exams isn't an easy feat. The results may not be what you had initially aimed for, but you should be proud of yourself for all your extraordinary efforts and preparations to pass the exams.

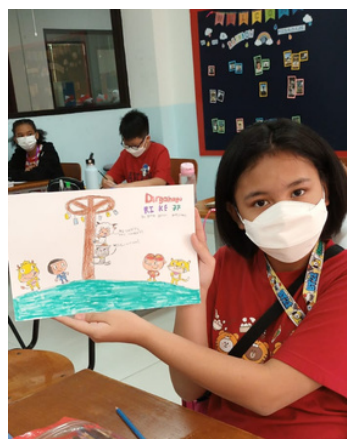

### June 2022 Portfolio of Evidence Results

We empathise with the disappointment that our parents and students have regarding the June 2022 Portfolio of Evidence Results. As a school, we are disappointed to see that our students were not given the grades they deserved. We understand that it is not an isolated case for our school but other schools here and around the world that opted for the POE route share the same dismal results.

The Cambridge International been flooded with similar concerns coming from various school exam officers. They can only offer formal avenues to make appeals or sit for a retake of the exam.

As a school, we lodged a formal complaint letter asking for clarification on the matter. We placed together our complaint and gathered the necessary information to let them know of the anomaly in the results. We hope that more and more schools will do the same thing to create pressure on them and hope that they will budge in the end.

However, this is as far as the schools can go. We understand that Cambridge will make the final decision and we will await their response.

We will pray for the best possible outcome for our NH students.

### B. RETAKE OF IGCSE, AS AND A- LEVEL ON NOVEMBER SERIES

Cambridge is supporting schools and students through this demanding time. If a student receives a grade via portfolio of evidence from the June 2022 series and then wishes to sit an exam for the same syllabus (at the same level) in the November 2022 series, they can do so free of charge. We will then credit the entry fee back to you. If we have submitted an enquiry about results for a student and he/she would now like to enter them for a retake instead, we can withdraw the enquiry and Cambridge will not charge the fee.

Please note, it is considered only retakes when both of the following are true:

- The exam series the entry is being made for has a separate retake entry deadline.
- The candidate is being entered for the same syllabus as they were in the exam series immediately before the current one





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Deadline to send retake information to us is on 18 September 2022 to give our exam committee time to register to Cambridge International and meet their deadline on 30 September 2022. Currently, registration for November 2022 series is already in late registration period and additional late fee may be charged by Cambridge International.
