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English Language Department's Article



All Hands on Deck: Handwriting Skills are Essential, too!

This article is an excerpt from Ms Chie's piece on Edutopia: **Extending Penmanship Lessons Beyond Elementary School.** At the time of writing, it is in the top three most popular articles on the educational site.

Penmanship is essential for students to learn, even beyond the lower primary levels. Although it has been "commonly perceived to be the responsibility of lower grade levels" (Bjarenas, 2022), students beyond these levels can also benefit from handwriting instruction.

Why is handwriting important for all levels?

Bjarenas (2022) highlights the following areas it enhances:

- It automates letter and word formations, which allows the writer to write faster and, hence, more and lightens the cognitive load.
- It quickens the development of reading and writing skills.
- It allows for more regular submission of work.
- It helps build memory.

How do we support students as they work on their handwriting fluency? Work on the "pressure points."

Pressure Points

• Pencil Grip

Students need to know how to hold their pen or pencil correctly. NH teachers are helping students develop their tripod grip.

• Pressure

The correct pressure must be applied to the writing instrument and paper. Often, a pad of paper or a notebook under the writing paper helps.

• Paper Hold

To support the pencil grip and the pressure on the writing instruments, the writer must hold the paper with their non-dominant hand.

• Stroke Formation

Closing the loop for accuracy, students need to be explicitly taught how to form their letters. Students must know which letters begin from the midline, the baseline, or the topline and where to go from there. Explicit instruction is provided by all English teachers from Year 1 to Year 6.

NationalHigh Jakarta School teachers (primary) are supporting our students' growth in this area. We think students can be supported at home, too. Keep an eye out for the pressure points when your child writes at home and reinforce their skills in this area.


