

NHJS ART & CRAFT

Art introduces students to a wide range of new ideas and experiences that they may have never encountered before. Through these artistic experiences, students can gain a deeper understanding of emotions. These experiences enable them to look within themselves as people often make choices driven by emotions and passions.

The NHJS Arts curriculum aims to help students:

- To develop creativity, critical thinking, and communication skills offering students alternative ways to express feelings, ideas, and arguments beyond words, while also nurturing aesthetic sensitivity and cultural awareness;
- To develop arts skills, techniques, and processes, construct knowledge, and cultivate positive values and attitudes:
- To develop observation skills, using the example of drawing or sketching. In this context, students must learn to see things as they truly are. This practice helps comprehending the appearance and feel of the object and its environment. Being more aware of the facts and information about the subject we want to create or draw can be beneficial when we are practically engaged in the work;
- To develop problem-solving skills, students can be taught through experimentation with craft materials and troubleshooting projects that do not turn out quite as expected. Therefore, we encourage them to think creatively and come up with solutions to artistic challenges. This process helps in developing critical thinking skills and fosters their ability to solve problems effectively.

Art most likely helps students to process their emotions and understand their surroundings. It enables them to see life from a different perspective and makes them feel more alive. Art has been an important part of human society since the beginning of time, serving as a tool for cultural exchange, education, and expression.

In art class, students learn the following:

- The elements and principles of art which are important as they serve as the foundation for creating and analysing works of art. This knowledge helps artists create visually appealing and emotionally impactful works of art.
- Various visual art forms such as painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, and crafts.
- Different visual art styles such as abstract, stylised, and realistic.

Visual arts learning outcomes:

- Students will demonstrate technical ability and craftsmanship in their artworks.
- Students will demonstrate an understanding of the elements of art and principles of design through effective compositions.
- Student will effectively communicate concepts through their artworks.
- Student will exhibit originality in their artworks.

Y11 FIELD TRIP

Exploring Sustainable Architecture: A Field Trip to Green Office Park, Sinarmas Land, Tangerang

On January 11, 2024, the Year 11 students went on their long-awaited field trip to the Green Office Park, Sinar Mas Land, Tangerang. As the undeniable effects of our environmental actions become increasingly apparent, green buildings have grown to become a vital component of sustainable development. The objective of this field trip was to expose the students to sustainable architectural practices, demonstrating a commitment to environmental stewardship.

Upon arriving, the first thing that caught the majority of the students' attention was the huge replica of the 'park'. Standing above a platform, we had a bird's-eye view of the entire campus, from the numerous buildings to the greenery that encompassed it. Following the demonstration, the students were led into a conference room, where they were greeted with a riveting presentation from the architects and engineers of the 'park'.

The lecture covered several topics, most notably the distinctions between 'Green Buildings' and conventional ones. The criteria for Green Buildings include appropriate site development, energy efficiency and conservation, water conservation, indoor health and comfort, and building environment management. The Green Office Park, as a certified green building, incorporates all of these elements and more. Design features such as large, open windows optimise natural lighting, creating a sense of spaciousness. Despite the numerous benefits, green buildings typically incur only slightly higher costs compared to conventional buildings, with an additional expense ranging from 3-5%.

During the field trip, students had the opportunity to engage in interactive sessions, observing features such as waste water plant treatment and solar panels. We gained insights into various aspects of green building design and its environmental impact. Even our everyday elements like traffic lights have been optimised for efficiency, reducing congestion and emissions by calculating the most efficient green light durations.

As the trip drew to a close, we explored the food court, indulged in restaurants, and spent time with our friends outside the classroom setting. Rested and fed, we boarded the bus, chattering along the way with stories of our newfound knowledge.

Quoting A. Togay Koralturk, an expert in green buildings and sustainability, 'Sustainability can only start in the mind.' Our field trip to the Green Office Park, Tangerang, provided us with a comprehensive understanding of the principles and practices vital to green building and sustainability.

We learned that designing buildings which are both beautiful and functional, while also minimising environmental impact, is entirely feasible. This experience will serve as a beacon of inspiration, guiding future endeavours and fostering a generation committed to creating an environmentally conscious world.
