DEAN'S ARTICLE

新学年的开始,你想要做出怎么样的改变?想要完成什么呢? 有时候会不会因为自己过度的兴奋/焦虑/关心,而造成了<mark>过度</mark>的精神内耗呢? <mark>过度</mark>精神内耗,简单的来说就是想得太多,但是做的太少。 例子:

一个**不内耗**的人,在准备晚饭与吃晚饭前后的过程,是这样。

快该吃晚饭了,今天晚上是什么?

嗯,好久没吃火锅了,在家里吃火锅吧。

说干就干,下班去超市买菜,回到家里收拾,简简单单一顿火锅。

吃饱喝足,收拾碗筷,愉悦的一天即将结束。

但是精神内耗的人,是这样:

晚上吃什么?火锅?日本餐?韩国餐?外卖?

算了, 我好像得减肥。

不行,我很饿,还是先吃吧。

那到底吃什么?

吃火锅太麻烦了,去逛街一个人不想,点外卖不好吃。

一件很小的事情,他们就能让自己纠结很久,内耗很久。

希望在新的学年里,我们都能勇敢地面对各种挑战。让自己的身、心灵健康,就要懂得减少精神内耗。

每一个里程碑活动都有其独特的目的和意义,并致力于发掘学生的潜能。以最近在6月份结束的八年级 COA 里程碑活动为例,学生的自律和习惯养成在其中起到了至关重要的作用。为期 25 天的行程对 13 至 14 岁的学生而言,不仅是一种挑战,更是一次宝贵的学习机会。在不同的挑战中,学生的潜能得到了充分的发掘。然而,发掘潜能只是开始,如何保持和发展这些潜能需要学生的持续努力,同时也离不开家长和老师的持续引导与支持。

在第一学期里,九年 级的学生将参加为期 14 天的思维习惯(Habit of Minds)里程碑活动。除了在学校内的活动,学生还将前往 Inagro 进行一系列的户外活动。这是一个培养自律、增强思维能力的绝佳机会,鼓励同学们积极参与,充分发掘自己的潜力。

与此同时,II 年级的学生将在不丹开展他们的"意义与目的"(Meaning and Purpose) 里程碑活动。虽然时间仅有一周,这个里程碑的主要目的是帮助学生在旅程中学习调整生活的节奏和心态,从自我调整到认识自我、发掘自我,最后达到肯定自我的目标。这是一次难得的心灵之旅,鼓励同学们积极参与,通过这段经历更好地理解自己,找到人生的方向和意义。

在接下来的两周里,学校将开展各种如火如荼的活动。首先,学生会主席的竞选将会异常激烈,每位候选人都展现出各自的优势。在竞选过程中,学生不仅要学习如何尊重自己的竞争对手,还要始终保持领导者的风度。这不仅是一次展示个人能力的机会,更是培养尊重与领导力的重要时刻。鼓励同学展现出最好的自己,同时尊重和欣赏他人的优点,共同营造良好的竞选氛围。

The Start of a New School Year: What Changes Do You Want to Make?

What do you want to achieve? Do you sometimes feel that your excitement, anxiety, or excessive concern leads to mental exhaustion?

Excessive mental exhaustion, means thinking too much but doing too little.

Example:

A person who does not suffer from mental exhaustion handles the process of preparing and eating dinner like this:

- It's almost dinner time. What's for dinner tonight?
- Hmm, it's been a while since we had hotpot. Let's have hotpot at home.
- They get right to it, go to the supermarket after work, buy the ingredients, come home and prepare, and enjoy a simple hotpot dinner.
- After eating, they clean up, and a pleasant day comes to an end.

However, a person experiencing mental exhaustion handles it like this:

- What's for dinner? Hotpot? Japanese foods? Korean foods? Takeout?
- Forget it, I should probably be on a diet.
- But I'm really hungry. I should eat something first.
- So, what should I eat?
- Hotpot is too much trouble. I don't want to go out alone, and takeout doesn't taste good.

They end up overthinking a simple decision, spending a lot of time and energy on a small matter.

In the new school year, I hope we can all bravely face various challenges. To maintain both physical and mental well-being, it's important to learn how to reduce mental exhaustion.

Each milestone programmes has its unique purpose and significance, aimed at uncovering students' potential. For instance, the recent Year 8 Coming of Age (COA) milestone programme which concluded in June, emphasized the importance of students' self-discipline and habit formation. The 25-day program was not only a challenge for 13-14-year-olds but also a valuable learning opportunity. Throughout various challenges, students' potential was thoroughly explored. However, discovering this potential is just the beginning; maintaining and developing it requires continuous effort from the students, as well as ongoing guidance and support from parents and teachers.

In the Term 1, Year 9 students will participate in a 14-day Habit of Minds (HOM) milestone programme. In addition to school-based activities, students will also head to Inagro for a series of outdoor activities. This is a fantastic opportunity to cultivate self-discipline and enhance thinking skills. Students are encouraged to actively participate and fully explore their potential.

Meanwhile, Year 11 students will embark on their Meaning and Purpose (MAP) milestone programme in Bhutan. Although the program lasts only one week, its primary goal is to help students learn to adjust their life rhythm and mindset throughout the journey, from self-adjustment to self-discovery and ultimately to self-affirmation. This is a rare spiritual journey, and students are encouraged to participate actively. Through this experience, they can gain a deeper understanding of themselves and find direction and meaning in their lives.

In the next two weeks, the school will be bustling with a variety of activities. First and foremost, the election for student council president will be highly competitive, with each candidate showcasing their unique strengths. During the campaign, students will not only learn how to respect their competitors but also maintain the demeanor of a true leader. This is not only an opportunity to demonstrate personal abilities but also a crucial moment for cultivating respect and leadership skills. Students are encouraged to present their best selves, while also respecting and appreciating the strengths of others, to foster a positive and supportive election environment.

In addition, the selections for the football, basketball, volleyball, and swimming teams have been successfully completed. As a member of these teams, I hope each athlete not only brings honor to the school but also sets a positive example for other students. In competitions, it's important to showcase individual excellence while also highlighting the spirit of teamwork.

YEAR 7 YOUNG LEADERS' CONVENTION

The Student Council hosted the Young Leaders' Convention (YLC) from July 18–20 2024. YLC is a particularly unique occasion since it is the final event for the 15th Batch of Student Council. It signifies the start of a new secondary life where Y7 students are given the chance to grow as leaders and people.



In order to set up and test out some of the events before the Y7 kids arrive, the organizing committee must get to the accommodation one day before the scheduled D-Day. Despite the short duration of the event, it was jam-packed with activities, so much so that many students and Organising Committee (OC) were exhausted at the end of the trip. However, despite being tired, so many memories were created that everyone will cherish forever. Nonetheless, we think most individuals would concur that the trip was both highly successful and educational.

Participants are greeted with cheers and icebreakers on their first day and split up into four families, each led by a different pair of family leaders. Following getting to know each other, the Governing Committee gave a presentation on this year's YLC theme: Igniting Independence, highlighting the importance of personal growth and being independent. They will have to cooperate with one another in their families to complete the tasks during the event. Students then participate in a creative tie-dye project where they design their clothing. The dance committee presents the first YLC dance to the kids



in preparation for their ultimate performance on Finale Night. They played their first team-designed games (TDG) later in the day, which consisted of several field games including relay games such as marble and water balloon passes. Now, using the surprise materials supplied, students must collaborate as a team in their families to create original games for TDG 2, which will be played by the other families. The evening concluded with a low-key campfire gathering where students and the organizing committee (OC) met to share memories and indulge in a ton of delicious food, including roasted corn and smores.



To get everyone ready for the day, the OCs led morning stretching on the second day. Students participated in a scavenger hunt organized by the Student Council in their families, after which we had a master chef cooking competition, followed by playing the TDG 2 games they prepared the day before. Following a brief intermission, the kids engaged in an extremely exciting game of TDG 3, and water games, and proceeded to learn their second mass dance. These activities included a slip & slide, which was the most entertaining, and a water relay in which

families competed to earn the most points for a food auction. The students get ready for finale night after washing up and getting changed. With balloons and LED lights decorating the meeting room for a final celebration before the event finishes, this was the most anticipated night. Singing and dancing all night long, everyone had an amazing and unforgettable time. Before packing up and heading home, the students get together for one last mass dance and time with their families on the last day.

YEAR 10 - 12 I/A SUCCESS CAMP (STAGE 1)

The IGCSE/AS/A Level Success Camp, held on July 25 and 26, 2024, aimed to assist Year 10 to Year 12 students in refining their study practices and setting effective academic goals. This event marked the beginning of a three-phase program designed to build a solid foundation for students' exam preparation. The focus was on providing students with strategies and skills to help them set and achieve their academic objectives, particularly for the May/June 2025 Cambridge examinations.

During the camp, students took part in various sessions that highlighted the importance of goal setting. They engaged in motivational talks and workshops that offered practical advice on how to set realistic and attainable goals. Key to the camp was teaching students how to set SMART goals—Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-bound—and develop actionable plans to monitor their progress toward these goals. Students were guided through the process of creating their own SMART goals and drafting detailed action plans to help track and achieve these objectives.

Each day was structured to include a mix of study sessions, activities, and breaks to create an effective learning environment. On the first day, students participated in goal-setting exercises and workshops aimed at improving their study habits. The second day continued with strategies for studying effectively and focusing on integrating the techniques learnt during the first day into their routines.

The camp emphasised the significance of maintaining motivation and a positive attitude while pursuing academic goals. By learning to set specific and manageable objectives, students gained insights into how to organize their study efforts more effectively.

In addition to academic preparation, the camp offered workshops on stress reduction and time management, helping students learn how to balance study, rest, and recreational activities effectively. By attending the Success Camp, students gained valuable skills that will assist them in managing their exam preparation and reducing stress.

Overall, the Success Camp provided a foundational experience in goal setting and study skills. The next two stages of the program will continue to support and build on these initial skills for ongoing exam preparation and academic achievement.

WHAT ARE GROW LESSONS?

The GROW lesson is primarily anchored on the core values of NationalHigh Jakarta School. It is designed to reflect the commitment and dedication of the school to its avowed philosophy, vision, and mission. The GROW lesson is carefully planned to provide support to the academic program of the school and equip students with values and life skills to address the demands of everyday life. Thus, the GROW lesson is focused on seven broad themes that target the different aspects of growth and development of the students. - To provide guidance to students in making wise and better decisions in life, solve problems that are holding them back, learn new skills and to foster better adjustment in and outside school.
- To help students to become more autonomous or self-reliant, and more responsive in behaviour.
- To help develop confident and compassionate students, who are effective contributors to society, successful learners and responsible citizens.

GROW Booklets

Our students from Year 7 to Year 12 have been using GROW booklets these past two years as a part of their GROW lessons. And we are excited to introduce a Year 6 booklet for this academic year. These booklets are thoughtfully crafted as an integral part of our character and values learning programme. Each booklet is designed to engage students with reading articles, practical activities, worksheets, insightful reflections that highlight our core values and broad themes, By working through these booklets, students will have the opportunity to explore and internalise these essential values, helping them to grow into good sons and daughters as well-rounded individuals who contribute positively to their communities.





IPW YEARS 5 - 9: OBJECTIVES, SKILLS AND VALUES

The Interdisciplinary Project Work (IPW) AY 2024-2025

Overview and Objectives

The Interdisciplinary Project Work (IPW) for the academic year 2024–2025 is set to begin on 22 July 2024. This initiative, scheduled every Monday from 2.15 pm to 3.15 pm, is embedded in the class timetables of students from Year 5 to Year 9. The IPW serves as a cornerstone for fostering a holistic educational experience, emphasising creative expression, innovation, and the development of key life skills.

The primary objectives of the IPW include:

- 1. Fostering Creativity and Innovation: The programme provides a platform for students to showcase their creative and innovative talents, encouraging them to think outside the box and explore new ideas.
- 2. Enhancing Adversity Quotient (AQ): By engaging in challenging projects, students develop resilience and the ability to navigate difficulties, enhancing their AQ.
- 3. Promoting Passion-Based Learning: Students are encouraged to pursue projects that align with their interests, fostering a deeper engagement and a love for learning.
- 4. Cultivating PIAGET Values: The IPW aims to instil the PIAGET values, which are integral to the development of responsible and ethical individuals.
- 5. Incorporating 21st Century Skills: The program emphasises essential skills such as critical thinking, communication, collaboration, and digital literacy, preparing students for the future.

Project Categories and SDG Alignment

The IPW is inspired by the Projects Day model of Hwa Chong Institution (HCI), providing a structured yet flexible framework for students to explore and develop projects. The projects are aligned with the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), offering students a global perspective and a chance to contribute to meaningful change.

Students can choose from the following categories:

- 1. **Night of the Notables**: A mini-research project on prominent figures associated with the championing of achievements in the SDGs. (Year 5 only)
- 2. Experimental Research: Projects involving scientific experiments and empirical research methods.
- 3. **Non-experimental Research**: Projects based on qualitative or theoretical research without experimental components. (Years 7 9 only)
- 4. Invention: Development of new products or technologies.
- 5. **Resource Development**: Creation of educational or informational resources to aid learning and awareness.
- 6. Community Service and Outreach: Projects aimed at benefiting the community and promoting social responsibility. (Years 7 9 only)

Values and Vision

The IPW embodies a commitment to holistic education, where academic learning is integrated with character building and practical experience. By participating in these projects, students not only acquire knowledge but also develop a sense of responsibility towards society and the environment. The focus on the SDGs underscores the importance of global citizenship and the need for sustainable development.



Important Update on School Calendar AY2024-2025 Adjustments for Term 3 and Term 4
