

YEAR 7 MILESTONE PROGRAMME (DISCOVERING CHARACTER STRENGTHS

The Year 7 students and their mentors embarked on a transformative journey to Cikidang, Sukabumi, for the annual Year 7 Milestone Programme: Discovering Character Strengths. Held at Caldera Adventure Camp from March 13 to 15, 2025, the program saw thirty-three students fully immerse themselves in a range of physical, mental, and team-building activities designed to help them explore their potential and capabilities.

Day 1 began with team-building games that encouraged students to step out of their cliques and collaborate with peers from other classes. This was followed by an exhilarating four-hour off-road trip into the mountains. Along the way, students marvelled at vast palm oil plantations, dense rainforest canopies, and remote communities. Stopovers allowed them to continue team-building exercises amidst the serene forest.

Day 2 started with morning exercise and breakfast before students and mentors hopped onto pick-up trucks for a one-hour journey to Taman Nasional Gunung Halimun Salak (Mount Halimun Salak National Park). They explored a sprawling tea plantation and embarked on a 45-minute hike to a hidden waterfall. Students had a blast playing in the refreshing river water at the waterfall's base.

In the afternoon, participants split into two groups: those with parental permission enjoyed a thrilling 9-km whitewater rafting adventure after a safety briefing, while others engaged in a meticulous art activity using only pencils, which tested their patience, focus, and perseverance. The artistic results were truly impressive.

Evenings were dedicated to debriefing and reflection sessions, where students shared their experiences, reflected on the day's activities, and journaled about their self-discoveries. Some student reflections highlighted the profound impact of the programme:

"I applied the value of adaptability. I am not used to being in a challenging place, like being far away into the forest and mountains. There are insects everywhere but I need to understand that they are here because this is where they live. I had to adapt and get used to them being around."

FREE SCHOOL TERM 1

As part of NationalHigh Jakarta School's long-time commitment to our nation-building project, we started this year's Free School program on 5 October 2024, bringing back the long-awaited event dedicated to educating and instilling key values within underprivileged children. This year, our project amassed a total of 45 keen and excited children from a local village here in West Jakarta, all ready to learn and develop under the careful guidance of our student teachers.



Throughout Term 1, we held sessions on:

- 5 October 2024
- 19 October 2024
- 26 October 2024
- 18 January 2025
- 25 January 2025

Each Saturday morning, vibrance and enthusiasm filled the halls of our school campus as the various kids flocked to their classrooms, all looking forward to a thrilling day of learning and fun. To allow for an individualised education program, the children were divided into three different categories based on their grade—Y1-Y2, Y3-Y4, and Y5-Y6. Children had immense fun undergoing the carefully-planned program, consisting of a striking balance between academically-focused subjects like Math, Science, and English, and engaging co-curricular activities like Dance and Art.





Astounding progress was observed during the many weeks of schooling, with some students going from quiet and restrained individuals, often afraid of speaking up and voicing their thoughts and opinions, to friendly and outgoing children, eager to learn and always asking thought-provoking questions. Beyond academics, several key values were also instilled within the children, including teamwork, integrity, and adaptability, all helping the children become nurtured and principled. Every basketball match, every hands-on activity, and every class discussion served as an opportunity to inspire growth within the ambitious learners.



Aside from their lessons, the kids spent a lot of time practicing dance in preparation for a performance at the Fairgrounds event. They worked hard on their routine, dancing to "Waka Waka", making sure every step and movement was in sync.





At the Fairgrounds event, led by their age group heads, the students had the opportunity to explore and enjoy the festival atmosphere. They walked around the Fairgrounds, buying items from booths, playing games like the rodeo bull and arcade games, and experiencing all the fun the event had to offer. Free School Field Trip



On the 8th of March, 2025, Student Council Committee 1 held the Free School field trip. There were 14 OCs and 3 SC mentors who came for the supervision of the field trip to Taman Mini Indonesia Indah (TMII), specifically in Ganara Art. It was organised as part of SC's outreach program Free School, but this served as a special exception: this day was an enriching retreat that offered both a refreshing escape from the usual weekly classroom routine and a captivating journey of new experiences. Objectives of this field trip include: fostering a sense of community engagement and social responsibility among the Student Council and Free School kids; providing educational and recreational experiences for the Free School kids; encouraging creativity, and artistic expression and fostering friendship among the Free School kids through fun hands-on activities.

Upon departure from NH at 11am, we proceeded to Yayasan DKAI followed by the village in Joglo to pick up the Free School kids, and at around 12.20pm, we arrived in TMII and promptly proceeded to Ganara Art, an art-crafting station within the park. Here, the Free School kids participated in two engaging art activities prepared to enhance their creativity and artistic skills, both activities facilitated by Ms Brenda:

- 1. Tote Bag Designing: The kids used paint to design and decorate their own tote bags, allowing them to express their imagination and creativity however they wish, whether it's drawing scenic landscapes or their favorite fictional characters, while learning basic painting techniques, such as color mixing to get different colors.
- 2. Pottery Making: Using clay, the kids crafted their own pottery pieces, exploring the fundamentals of shaping and molding materials with their hands. They were taught a tutorial of the pottery-making process from kneading and shaping the clay to adding some intricate details. This activity enriched their fine motor skills and patience, and they took their handmade creations home as a special souvenir and keepsake from the trip.

Throughout the event, the NH OCs who volunteered to help out in this field trip guided and assisted the Free School kids, ensuring they had a fun and rewarding experience. The interactions fostered camaraderie and a spirit of cooperation between the OC students and the Free School kids. The event was a fulfilling and memorable experience for all participants, and it set a positive example for future community service activities. We left TMII at approximately 3pm, and dropped them off at their respective homes at around 5pm.





This field trip to Ganara Art in TMII successfully achieved its objectives by providing the Free School kids with opportunities to learn, create, and enjoy themselves in artistic ways, in a nurturing environment. It also served as a valuable experience for the field trip OCs, reinforcing the importance of social service and empathy. Overall, this initiative not only strengthened the bond between the Free School kids and the NationalHigh SC students but also emphasised the importance of education and creative expression.

Year 4 Students Explore Indonesian Science Centre (PP IPTEK)

On 14 March 2025, the Year 4 students embarked on an exciting learning journey to the Indonesian Science Centre (PP IPTEK) at Taman Mini Indonesia Indah, where they engaged in a day of discovery and hands-on exploration.

The visit aimed to enhance their understanding of key concepts across multiple subjects, including Science, Mathematics, and Languages. Through interactive activities and workshops, students had the opportunity to connect classroom knowledge with real-world applications.

For Science, students explored the topic of light and shadows. They participated in engaging exhibits that demonstrated how light travels, and applications of light, among others. A highlight of the trip was the Science Creativity Workshop, where students learned to construct their own periscopes, applying their knowledge of light reflection in a fun and practical way.

Mathematical concepts came to life as students tackled topics such as shapes, angles and symmetry and operations through the creation of a periscope. These experiences helped reinforce their learning in an enjoyable and immersive manner, making abstract concepts more tangible and accessible.

In addition to Science and Mathematics, students were encouraged to express their experiences through narrative writing. They were encouraged to use English, Chinese, or Bahasa Indonesia, to document their observations, reflections, and favourite moments from the trip, turning their learning journey into compelling personal stories.

The learning journey to PP IPTEK provided an enriching experience that deepened students' understanding of scientific and mathematical principles while also fostering creativity and storytelling skills. This immersive trip left a lasting impression, inspiring young minds to explore and appreciate the wonders of science and math in their everyday lives.

The students shared their excitement about the trip, expressing enthusiasm for the hands-on experiments and the chance to see science and math in action outside the classroom. Here's what the students had to say about the learning journey.

"My favourite activity was the earthquake simulator because it felt realistic. Three exhibits/demonstrations I found interesting were the Van de Graaff generator that makes hair stand due to electricity, the optical illusion corridor and the launching of the water rocket. If I could bring one exhibit home, it would be the water rocket because I live near a park and it would be interesting to test if I can use it to water the plants."



"I was chosen to assist in the science demonstration using liquid nitrogen. After play dough was placed in liquid nitrogen, I helped throw it to the ground to see what happens. The liquid nitrogen froze the play dough so it broke to pieces when I threw it on the floor. For me, this was one of the highlights of the trip. The other two were the water rocket demonstration and the laser trap. I was actually hoping to see an electricity demonstration where they put one person in a cage and switch on the electricity to create lightning like what I saw in Singapore. If I could bring home something from the Science Centre, it would have been the liquid nitrogen so I can test it with other objects at home."

"My favourite activity was the rocket launcher. We learned that if there is no water, the rocket will not launch far but if there is water, it can fly very far because of the pressure from the water. Three most interesting activity for me were the earthquake simulation which felt very real, the science show where they demonstrated interesting reactions using liquid nitrogen and the tsunami simulation where we get to create a tsunami. If there was one thing I would have loved to experience, it would be a bullet train simulator because I want to feel how fast it could travel. It was cool that we were able to bring home the periscope we made."

"I love learning about machines and my favourite activity is when we got to control a digital aeroplane by flying it and landing it safely. I also loved the gyroscope where we sit holding a spinning wheel and it moves to the direction we tilt it towards. The other activities that were interesting to me were the earthquake simulator and making a small tsunami. I wanted to see the dinosaur displays but we did not go there. If I could bring one exhibit home, it would be the mechanical dinosaurs because it would be interesting to learn how they move."




