

# SC TRAINING

On the 16 - 20 August, the Student Council held its first training. This training was **organized to prepare new members with hands-on experience across different functions while also building teamwork and leadership skills.** It served as the foundation for setting the tone and direction of the Council's activities for the year ahead, ensuring that members are equipped to represent and serve not just for the interest of the school, but the welfare of the students.



The first day began with a short briefing in the SC Room, after which members joined the Functions Briefing. Here, the Governing Committee, Strategic Committee, Student Mentors, and SC Mentors guided members through the structure of their functions, explained key responsibilities and led simple interactive activities such as fixing a sample parent letter and budget list. These sessions helped members understand how each role contributes to the wider Student Council.

The highlight of the day was proposal making, where each committee worked on proposals for their assigned events and Nation Building. Proposals included event descriptions, timelines and budget lists, giving each member practice in planning and collaboration, in preparation for the upcoming KP presentation in two weeks.



After 2.5 hours, each committee presented their proposal to the SC Mentors, Student Mentors, Gov Comm and Strat Comm, who provided constructive feedback. The day ended with final preparations for the SC Investiture Ceremony.



The second day was focused on finalizing proposals and presentations. Committees refined their ideas and incorporated the feedback they had received from the first day. This was followed by another round of presentations, where final inputs were given by SC Mentors,

Student Mentors and the Governing and Strategic Committees. These sessions helped ensure that each proposal was clear, well-prepared and ready for formal presentation to the KPs.

Overall, this training was a meaningful and memorable experience. It provided members with valuable exposure to event planning, leadership practice, and team collaboration, while also instilling a shared sense of purpose for the year ahead. The Student Council looks forward to applying these lessons in upcoming projects and wishes all members a successful journey as they serve the school community together.
